Where do you think AI will have the greatest value/ impact for lawyers going forward. What other "top" technologies do you see as critical to legal professionals' current / future success.

Agile organizations think of technology not as a supporting capability but as being integrated with and core to every aspect of the organization. The legal landscape has shifted, and clients want more transparency, immediacy, and value for their legal providers. Concepts such as self-service client portals, contract creation and review, contact negotiation.

In fact, AI could be quite useful, for example, in contract review, as it could easily do in few minutes what lawyers

take hours to validate. Blockchain is also raising among us. The combination between Machine Learning/ Artificial Intelligence and Blockchain will open a new world to legal professionals and law firms.
